Brief Introduction of RWU

- Rawalpindi Women University (RWU) was upgraded from Government Post Graduate College, Satellite Town, Rawalpindi, as University on August 26, 2019. Government Post Graduate College was established in 1951. RWU was established under the Rawalpindi Women University Act XXIX of 2019 dated December 13, 2019. The Act provides the essential guidelines for the overall functions of the University.
- 2. Currently, our student population is around 4500, and the girls are offered degree programs in 15 disciplines of natural sciences, social sciences, management sciences, humanities and liberal arts.

The University offers BS Degree Program in disciplines of Botany, Chemistry, Computer Science, English, Fine Arts, Information Technology, Management Sciences, Mass Communication, Mathematics, Political Science, Psychology, Physics, Statistics, Zoology till Spring 2022 Semester and new program of BS Sociology is planned to be launched in Fall 2022 admissions.

Dr. Anila Kamal took charge as Rawalpindi Women University's first Vice Chancellor on July 27, 2021. She is an alumni of this institution having long illustrious traditions of success stories. She did her Masters in Psychology from this institution, M.Phil and PhD from Qauid-i-Azam University and Postdoc from College of New Jersey, USA. In a graceful ceremony held at the Conference Room, RWU, Prof. Dr. Saima Hamid handed over the charge to Dr. Anila Kamal. Afterwards Prof. Dr. Anila Kamal had a meeting with all Heads of Department. Flowers were presented and a cake cutting ceremony was held and ended with prayer for progress of the institution.

Dr. Anila expressed her commitment to uphold academic excellence and to create an environment that nurtures and empowers students to achieve their goals.

A brief introduction of Prof. Dr. Anila Kamal

Prof. Dr. Anila Kamal Ph.D (Tenured Professor) is known as an expert in the field of Psychology of Gender. Her extensive research on sexual harassment faced by women in Pakistan has resulted in the development of public policies to combat such issues in workplace settings, leading to the passing of the

Sexual Harassment Act in 2010. In July 2021, she assumed the responsibility of the first Vice Chancellor of Rawalpindi Women University, Pakistan, after serving as the Director of the National Institute of Psychology (NIP), Center of Excellence, Quaid-i-Azam University for over 13 years.

Dr. Anila holds a PhD from Quaid-i-Azam University (1998) and a Post-doctoral fellowship from The College of New Jersey, USA (2005). She began her career at NIP that spread over 30 years, joined as a lecturer and promoted upto a Tenured Professor and Director. Dr. Anila has served as the Chief Editor of the Pakistan Journal for Psychological Research and an Editor of Pakistan Psychological Abstracts from 1992 until 2021. Additionally, she has served on the advisory boards of many national and international journals.

Dr. Anila has published over 170 research articles on various tabooed yet pressing issues in the patriarchally oriented Pakistani collectivist culture in the field of social psychology including sexual harassment, honour killing, rape, acid burn violence, female crime, hijab, child marriages, domestic violence, sexual and reproductive health, HIV/AIDS, child labour, transgender issues, juvenile delinquency, infertility, menopause, and mental health. She has undertaken many projects funded by UNESCO, OXFAM, Ministry of Women Development, UNDP, PAEC, and HEC.

Dr. Anila is highly respected for her research-oriented approach embracing post-positivism and feminism, and she has never been driven by political activism. She is an expert not only in gender issues but also in qualitative and quantitative research paradigms, psychometrics, and assessment and evaluation. She has produced around 70 M.Phil and 21 Ph.D graduates and is also known for her work in the field of Psychometry, having developed over 35 indigenous tests and scales. Among her most significant contributions is the development of the Pakistani Urdu version of the "Wechsler Intelligence Scale for Children (WISC-PAK 2015)", which is published by PsychCorp Pearson Clinical Assessment.

Dr. Anila has acted as the chief organizer of many national and international conferences at the National Institute of Psychology, Quaid-i-Azam University, and is a member of number of national and international professional bodies and societies.


Webinar on Academic and Career Opportunities

Milli Naghma competition




Webinar on Pakistan Movement




A farewell and welcome party
